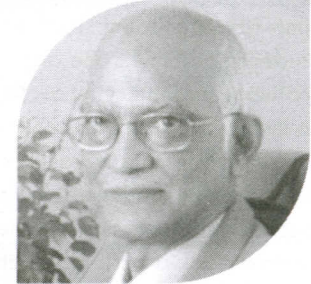
## A Man with a Mission

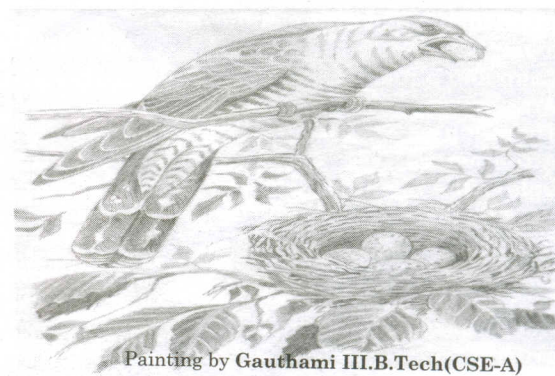

**StuTalker:** How do you feel to be the first person to be placed from our college?

**Prasanth:** Good, in fact I feel proud, this forms a good example for juniors, it requires a lot of determination and fire within you to achieve something.

**StuTalker:** What do you feel are the minimum basic requirements a student should have to be placed?

**Prasanth:** Technical knowledge with good communication skills is required with a minimum of 65% and should concentrate more on C, C++, Java and operating system knowledge, good presentation skills and at least one seminar should be given, since it has to be mentioned in the resume.

**StuTalker:** There are many doubts regarding JKC's fee pattern after being placed, can you detail us the process as you are placed through JKC.

**Prasanth:** After being selected by any company you have to pay 18K to JKC of which 13K will be returned to as stipend after a period of time, so basically you pay 5K to JKC.

**StuTalker:** What according to you is the right approach to the H.R. Interview?

**Prasanth:** Just be cool in the interview process give a little smile occasionally in the process, be positive and don't keep quiet, answer all questions and be perfect in your core subjects.

**StuTalker:** When should we start preparing for the interview?

**StuTalker:** Any message to your juniors that you would like to give?

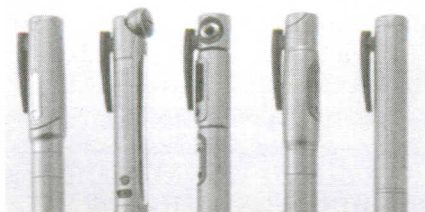

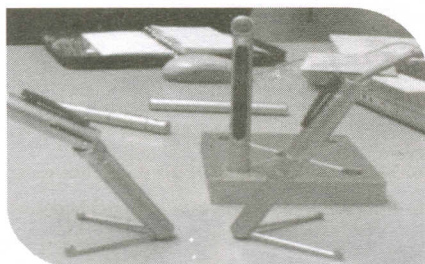

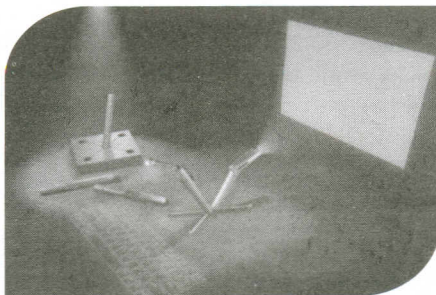

In the revolution of miniature of computers, the scientists are ahead with Bluetooth technology... See the forthcoming computers within your pockets...

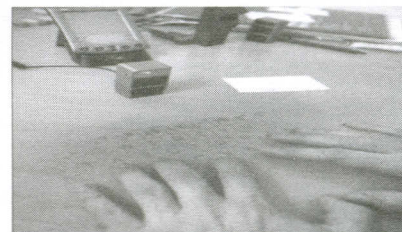


This pen sort of instrument produces both the monitor as well as the keyboard on flat surfaces from where you can just carry out the normal operations you do on your desktop.

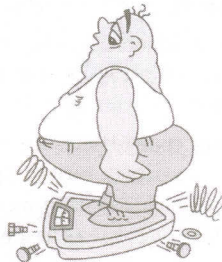
- 1). The lecturers don't teach. The students don't study. The only guy who benefits is the one who owns the 'dhaba' next to the college.
