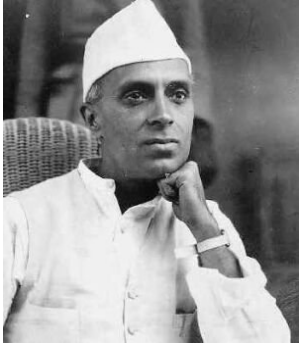

Apple Japan to replace iPod nano batteries



Apple's Japan unit is offering to replace the batteries of first-generation models of the **iPod Nano**, a device that has seen its share of complaints about overheating that triggered fires and burns for some customers.



iPod Nano unit, Apple spokesman Tom Neumayr told CNET.

The overheating battery, which Apple says occurs in very rare cases, is symptomatic of iPod Nanos sold between September 2005 and December 2006, and could

Firefox add-on blocks malicious search results

In their never-ending quest to steal your credit card and bank account numbers, passwords, Social Security numbers, and other sensitive personal information, malware purveyors go wherever the eyeballs are. Lately, the bad guys have increasingly been targeting the links served up by Web search engines.

Two computer security firms recently issued press releases touting the dangers of searching for popular terms, such as the names of starlets or items in the news. Barracuda Labs' **2010_Midyear Security Report** highlights the risks of entering

a popular topic in Google, Bing, or Yahoo. The company entered thousands of search terms in these engines over a two-month period and found that many of the top results returned led to sites hosting malware.

Similarly, Symantec accompanied the release of its free **Norton Safe Web Lite** Web site rating tool with a **study** claiming 10 percent or more of the results returned by one-third of topical search terms led to malware.

Stephen Hawking says he's an optimist. Perhaps theoretical physicists have an idiosyncratic definition of the word. For in an interview with Big Think, Hawking suggested that unless the human race begins to inhabit outer space, it will disappear. His tinge of optimism is painted in quite muted colors. "If we can avoid disaster for the next two centuries, our species should be safe as we spread into space," he told BigThink. But those two centuries

might well be fraught with far more crises than ever before, he said. Hawking is worried about the way humans are eating up finite resources and commented that our genetic code "carries selfish and aggressive instincts," which have helped humanity survive so often in times gone by.



Geolocation Services Are Coming!

If Facebook provides you with the option, would you let your friends know where you are? The long-rumored geolocation "check-in" feature at Facebook is slated to debut within weeks, multiple sources familiar with the matter told CNET.

It's going to take the form of an application programming interface (API) for third-party companies on the Facebook developer platform, integrating existing "check-in" start-ups more deeply into the massive social-networking service and in turn permitting location-aware data to become a part of existing platform applications.

Facebook declined to provide much detail. "We are working on location features and product integrations, which we'll be launching in the coming months, and we'll share more details when appropriate," spokesman Larry Yu told CNET.

Among developers, too, Facebook is still being tight-lipped regarding the exact na-

ture of the service; the API work has not yet been finalized, though one source in the developer community said that engineers at Facebook "are building it out hard-core" at the moment. Another source hinted that the internal development deadline may be as early as next week, but that Facebook has not been clear about whether this will be reached on time or extended.

At least one start-up in the geolocation space was told by a Facebook insider that it might want to think about changing the language of a thumbs-up type of feature to "like," possibly preparing for integration of Facebook's ubiquitous "like" buttons.

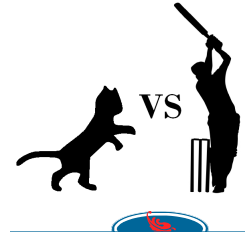

Indian Rupee Symbol

India has finally got a symbol for the Rupee and joined a select club of countries whose currencies have a unique identity.

The Union Cabinet on Thursday approved the design, which includes both the Devnagiri 'Ra' and the Roman capital 'R' and has two parallel lines running at the top. The parallel lines symbolise the equal to sign.

"With this India will join an elite group of countries which have a distinct currency symbol. It denotes the robustness of Indian economy. I will now hold up the design that was finally selected. This was sent in by Udaya Kumar," said Minister for Information and Broadcasting **Ambika Soni** in New Delhi.

She said that the Rupee symbol was a nice blend of modernity and Indian culture.³

The symbol selected has been designed by an Indian Institute of Technology-Bombay postgraduate D Udaya Kumar and was selected from among five short listed symbols. Kumar, who will join the Department of Design at IIT Guwahati

on Friday, explained that the design is based on the Indian Tricolour.

"My design is based on the Tricolour with two lines at the top and white space in between. I wanted the symbol for the Rupee



to represent the Indian flag. It is a perfect blend of Indian and Roman letters: a capital 'R', and Devnagari 'Ra', which represent rupiya, to appeal to inter-

national and Indian audiences.

After working on the design for few months, I shortlisted eight to 10 designs and then refined them further till I got this one," said Kumar.

His entry was chosen from 3,000 designs competing for the currency symbol. He will get an award of Rs 2.5 lakh. All new notes will now bear the symbol.

Though the symbol will not be printed or embossed on currency

notes or coins, it would be included in the 'Unicode Standard' and major scripts of the world to ensure that it is easily displayed and printed in the electronic and print media.

Among currencies with distinctive identities, only the pound sterling has its symbol printed on the notes.

Unicode is an international standard that allows text data to be interchanged globally without conflict. After incorporation in the global and Indian codes, the symbol would be used by all individuals and entities within and outside the country.

The symbol will be adopted in a span of six months in the country, and within 18 to 24 months globally, Soni said, adding that it will feature on computer keyboards and software for worldwide use.

3. Note making is most important for faring well in TOEFL exam. So practice note making by listening to English news, documentaries etc. This makes all integrated tasks comfortable.

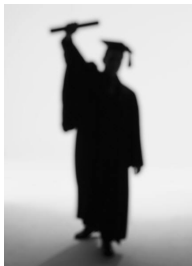

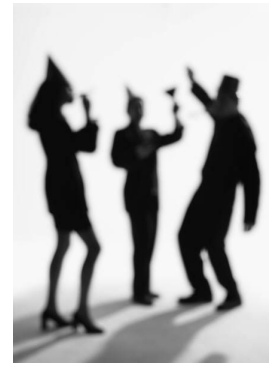

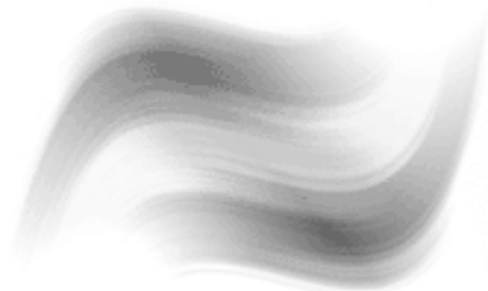
College updates
