National Youth Day 2010- Swami Vivekananda

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National Youth Day is celebrated in India on 12 January on the birthday of Swami Vivekananda. In 1984, the Government of India declared and decided to observe the birthday of Swami Vivekananda as a National Youth Day every year from 1985 onwards. To quote from the Government of India's communication, 'it was felt that the philosophy of Swamiji and the ideals for which he lived and worked could be a great source of inspiration for the Indian Youth. Swami Vivekananda's birthday, according to the Indian Almanac is on Pausa Krishna Saptami tithi, which falls on different dates in the English Calendar every year. This is observed in various centers of Ramakrishna Math and Mission in a traditional Hindu manner which includes mangalarati, special worship, meditation, devotional songs, religious discourses etc.,



Vivekananda was born to an orthodox Hindu family in Bengal 1863. From an early age he displayed signs of great compassion and also the qualities of a natural leader. Vivekananda had a sharp intellect and devoured literature from both East and West. This included Western philosophy and the great

English poets. Vivekananda particularly liked the rational reasoning of the West and was easily dismayed by many of the religious superstitions and the cultural decline that Indian society found itself in. Thus Vivekananda was drawn to join the Brahma Samaj. The Brahma Samaj was a modern Hindu movement who sought to revitalize Indian life and spirituality through a rationalistic approach and abandonment of image worship. Swami Vivekananda is regarded as one of India's foremost nation-builders. His teachings influenced the thinking of other national leaders and philosophers, like Mahatma Gandhi, Jawaharlal Nehru, Subhas Chandra Bose, Aurobindo Ghosh, Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan

Self-Drive Vehicle On The Go...:-



Anoushka Shankar: The young and beautiful daughter of sitar maestro Pandit Ravi Shankar, she has honed her skills under her father's guidance to become a world-renowned player. She is now composing and performing in the United Kingdom.

Imagine owning a car that does all the driving while you sit back and relax. Your fantasy seems to be getting closer to reality, thanks to scientists who are designing such a "self-drive" vehicle. A European team claims to be working on such a fantasy car which can drive itself - in fact, tests would start next year on such vehicles that "drive themselves" and could be on

roads within 10 years. 'The Daily Telegraph' reported. The road train would consist of six to eight vehicles whose occupants would be able to relax, read the paper or chat on mobiles while travelling; this'll be possible as their cars would be equipped with a navigation system and a transmitter unit that communicates with the lead vehicle, say scientists. This lead vehicle - possibly

a taxi a bus or a truck - will drive "normally" and effectively "do the motoring" for the rest of the road train. Drivers approaching their destination will take over control of their own vehicle, leave the convoy by exiting off to the side and then continue on their own to their respective destinations, according to the scientists.

LCD screen that interprets hand gestures

Scientists from Massachusetts Institute of Technology have developed a novel LCD screen that works by interpreting hand gestures, without touching the screen. They insist viewers can control on-screen objects by waving their arms in the air without touching the screen, let alone a mouse or keyboard. Although users can touch the screen to activate controls on the display but as soon as they lift their finger off the screen, the system can interpret their gestures in the

3 dimension effect. The screen — dubbed BiDi, short for bi-directional — allows users to manipulate or interact with objects on the screen in 3D. They can clearly image objects that are in direct contact with the screen, but anything further away is blurred. The new system uses an array of optical sensors that are arranged behind a grid of liquid crystals, similar to those used in LCD displays. They physically control how much light passes from

the display's backlight. In the new system a regular grid of hundreds of pixels spread across the screen use their liquid crystals to create a tiny hole that acts as a pinhole camera lens, focusing an image of the scene in front onto a thin translucent film a few centimeters behind the LCD. Those images are detected by a camera inside BiDi, allowing the device to know what is happening before it.

India develops affordable nano sensors to detect heart attack:-

A team of Indian scientists and engineers has developed affordable sensors using nano materials to detect a heart attack quickly. "The device with nano sensors can not only detect a heart attack, but also transmit its signal through a wireless interface to doctors located remotely for quick diagnosis and treatment," the Indian Institute of Technology professor, Mr. V. Ramgopal Rao, said on Wednesday. The three-dimension

sensors use nano electrical mechanical system (NEMS) of its polymer material to convert any abnormal movement in the heart muscles into an electrical signal for detecting a cardiac symptom," Mr Rao said at a plenary session on 'Nano Technology and Education' at the country's premier science event. Nanoparticles, measured as one billionth of a meter (39 inches), in a polymer generate electrical current through biochemical process of the enzymes produced in the heart. When the heart goes through se-

vere stress or strain, it suddenly releases enzymes (protein molecules) in excess, causing pressure on its blood vessels and exertion, which manifest as chest pain, perspiration or even a cardiac arrest.

A Legend – Major Unnikrishnan

Sandeep joined the National Defense Academy (NDA) in 1995. He was a cadet, part of the Oscar Squadron (No. 4 Battalion) and a pass-out of the 94th Course of NDA. He graduated as a Bachelor of Arts (Social science stream).

His NDA friends remember him as "selfless", "generous" and "calm and composed"

"In 1995, we were a bunch of gangly 18-year-olds, wondering what the hell we were doing climbing up Sinhgad fort on a miserable, rainy day, when I first met Unni. He was an ikki, a first timer, bone-weary, but always gung-ho. When we made it to the top, the first stop was for a fill of water. Soggy, bushed and thirsty, we ran to the natural spring that has been feeding soldiers since the days of Chhatrapati Shivaji. Unni was the first to reach and started drawing water from the well. We lined up with our canteens, but a tourist first held out her water bottle. Unni filled it. Without a word - and with a smile to us - Unni dutifully doled out his generosity. He never got to us. He himself never got a sip. The order came to move on." -An NDA course mate.

He was commissioned as Lieutenant to the 7th Battalion of the Bihar Regiment (Infantry) on July 12, 1999. After serving the Indian Army in different locations in Jammu & Kashmir and Rajasthan to counter insurgencies for two terms, he was selected to join the National Security Guards. On completion of training, he was assigned to the Special Action Group (SAG) of NSG on January 2007 and participated in various operations of the NSG.

He was a popular officer who was loved and adored by his seniors and juniors alike. During the 'Ghana course' (at the Commando Wing (Infantry School), Belgaum), the most difficult course of the Army, Major Unnikrishnan topped the course, earning an "Instructor Grading" and commendation from seniors. Perhaps this was the reason or his passion for bravery that he opted for the NSG commando service which he joined on deputation in 2006. During Operation Vijay in Kargil on the evening of December 31, 1999, Major Sandeep led a team of six soldiers and managed to establish a post 200 meters from the enemy and under direct enemy observation and fire "Long Live Major Sandeep Unnikrishnan", "Sandeep Unnikrishnan Amar Rahee" - these are the lines that were heard outside the Bangalore house of the NSG Commando Major Sandeep Unnikrishnan as thousands lined up to pay their last homage to the martyr who laid his life to save thousands of innocent people at hotel Taj Mahal, Mumbai. The funeral of Major Sandeep Unnikrishnan was held with full military honors.
