Academic Regulations for M. Tech (Regular) Program, 2021-22 (Effective for the students admitted into I year from the Academic Year 2021-22 and onwards)

1. Post-Graduate Degree Programmes in Engineering & Technology (PGP in E & T)VBIT(Autonomous) offers TwoYears (FourSemesters) full-time Master of Technology (M. Tech.) Degree programmes, under ChoiceBased Credit System (CBCS) at its campus indifferent branches of Engineering and Technology with different specializations.

2. Eligibility for Admissions

- i. Admission to the PGPs shall be made subject to eligibility, qualification and specializations prescribed by the Institute from time to time, for each specialization under each M.Techprogramme.
- ii. Admission to the post graduate programme shall be made on the basis of either the merit rankor Percentile obtained by the qualified student in the relevant qualifying GATE Examination/the merit rank obtained by the qualified student in an entrance test conducted by TelanganaState Government (PGECET) for M.Tech. programmes / an entrance test conducted by JNTUH/ on the basis of any other exams approved by the University, subject to reservations as laid down by the Govt. from time to time.
- iii. The medium of instructions for all PG Programmes will be ENGLISHonly.

3. M.Tech. Programme (PGP in E & T) Structure

i. The M.Tech Programmes in VBIT are of Semester pattern, with FourSemestersconsisting of Twoacademic years, each academic year having TwoSemesters (First/Oddand Second/Even

Semesters). Each Semester shall be of 22 weeks duration (inclusive of Examinations), with a minimum of 90 instructional days per Semester.

- ii. The student shall not take more than four academic years to fulfill all the academic requirements for the award of M.Tech. degree from the date of commencement of first year first semester, failing which the student shall forfeit the seat in M.Tech. programme.
- iii. UGC/AICTEspecified definitions/descriptions are adopted appropriately for various terms and abbreviations used in these PG academic regulations, as listed below:

iv. Semester Scheme

Each Semester shall have 'Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE)' and 'Semester EndExamination (SEE)'. Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) and Credit Based SemesterSystem (CBSS) are taken as 'references' for the present set of Regulations. The terms'SUBJECT' and 'COURSE' imply the same meaning here and refer to 'Theory Subject', or'Lab Course', or 'Design/Drawing Subject', or 'Seminar', or 'Comprehensive Viva', or'Project', or 'Technical Paper Writing' as the case may be.

v. Credit Courses

All subjects/courses are to be registered by the student in a semester to earn credits whichshall be assigned to each subject/course in an L: T: P: C (Lecture Periods: Tutorial Periods: Practical: Credits)

Other student activities like study tour, guest lecture, conference/workshop participations, technical paper presentations, and identified mandatory courses, if any, will not carry credits.

vi. Subject Course Classification

All subjects/courses offered for the Post-Graduate Programme in E & T (M.Tech DegreeProgramme) are broadly classified as follows.

4. Course Registration

- i. A 'Faculty Advisor or Counselor' shall be assigned to each specialization, who will advise onthe Post Graduate Programme (PGP), its Course Structure and Curriculum, Choice/Option forSubjects/ Courses, based on his competence, progress, prerequisites and interest.
- ii. The Academic Section of the College invites 'Registration Forms' from students within 15days from the commencement of class work through 'ON-LINE SUBMISSIONS', ensuring 'DATE and TIME Stamping' for the first semester. The ON-LINE Registration Requests for any 'CURRENTSEMESTER' shall be completed BEFORE the commencement of SEEs (Semester EndExaminations) of the 'PRECEDING SEMESTER'.
- iii. A Student can apply for ON-LINE Registration, ONLY AFTER obtaining the 'WRITTENAPPROVAL' from his Faculty Advisor,

- which should be submitted to the College AcademicSection through the Head of Department (a copy of it being retained with Head ofDepartment, Faculty Advisor and the Student).
- iv. If the Student submits ambiguous choices or multiple options or erroneous entries during ONLINERegistration for the Subject(s) / Course(s) under a given/ specified Course Group/Category as listed in the Course Structure, only the first mentioned Subject/ Course in thatCategory will be taken into consideration.
- v. Subject/ Course Options exercised through ON-LINE Registration are final and CANNOT bechanged, nor can they be inter-changed; further, alternate choices also will not be considered. However, if the Subject/ Course that has already been listed for Registration by the Universityin a Semester could not be offered due to unforeseen or unexpected reasons, then the Studentwill be allowed to have alternate choice either for a new Subject, if it is offered, or for another existing Subject (subject to availability of seats). Such alternate arrangements will be made by the Head of Department, with due notification and time-framed schedule, within the FIRSTWEEK from the commencement of Class-work for that Semester.

5. Attendance Requirements

- i. The programmes are offered on the basis of a unit system with each subject being considered aunit.
- ii. Attendance in all classes (Lectures/Laboratories/Seminar) is compulsory. The minimumrequired attendance in each theory including the attendance of mid-term examination /Laboratory etc. is 75%. Two periods of attendance for each theory subject shall beconsidered, if the student appears for the mid-term examination of that subject. A studentshall not be permitted to appear for the Semester End Examinations (SEE), if his/her attendance is less than 75%.

- iii. A student's seminar report and seminar presentation will be evaluated, only if heensures a minimum of 75% of his attendance in seminar presentation classes during that semester.
- iv. Condoning of shortage of attendance(between 65% and 75%) up to a maximum of 10%(considering the days of attendance in sports, games, NCC, NSS activities and Medicalgrounds) in each subject of a semester shall be granted by the College Academic Committee.
- v. A student can use medical condonation facility only two times in the entire period of 4 semesters in the span of 2 years M.Tech program. Medical certificate along with the fitnesscertificate need to be submitted within 3 working days on returning to the class work.
- vi. Attendance for N.C.C. Camps or Inter Collegiate or Inter University or Inter State or International matches or debates or Educational excursion or such other Inter University activities as approved by the authorities, involving journeys outside the city in which the college is situated will not be counted as absence. However, such absence should not exceed two weeks of the period of instruction, in a semester. Students participating in the above events shall take prior permission from the authorities. Absence not exceeding one week, for activities like N.S.S., Inter-University Competitions and debates will be condoned if the candidate is sponsored by the University for such Activities. In any case overall class attendance alone (not including other considerations) should not be less than 65% in any subject
- vii. Shortage of Attendance below 65% in any subject shall in no case be condoned. A Student, whose shortage of attendance is not condonedin any subject(s) in any semester, is considered detained in that subject(s) and is not eligible to write Semester EndExamination(s) of such subject(s) in that semester, and he has

- to seek re-registration forthose subject(s) in subsequent semesters, and attend the same as and when offered.
- viii. A student fulfills the attendance requirement in the present semester, shall not be eligible forreadmission into the same class. A prescribed fee per subject shall be payable for condoning shortage of attendance.
- ix. A student shall put in a minimum required attendance in at least three theory subjects in IYear I semester for promotion to I Year II Semester.

6. Academic Requirements

- i. The following academic requirements have to be satisfied, in addition to the attendancerequirements mentioned in item no. 5. The performance of the candidate in each semestershall be evaluated subject-wise, with a maximum of 100 marks per subject / course (theory /practical), on the basis of Internal Evaluation and Semester End Examination.
- ii. A student shall be deemed to have satisfied the academic requirements and earned thecredits allotted to each subject/course, if he secures not less than 40% of marks (28 out of 70 marks) in the Semester End Examination, and a minimum of 50% of marks in the sumtotal of CIE (Continuous Internal Evaluation) and SEE (Semester End Examination) takentogether; in terms of Letter Grades and this implies securing 'B' Grade or above in asubject.
- iii. A student shall be deemed to have satisfied the academic requirements and earned thecredits allotted to a subject/ course, if he secures not less than 50% of the total marks. The student is deemed to have failed, if he (i) does not attend the comprehensive viva-voceas per the schedule given, or (ii) does not present the seminar as required, or (iii) does not present the Technical Paper Writing as required. In such a case, he may reappearfor

- comprehensive viva-voce in supplementary examinations and for seminar/ technicalpaper writing, in the subsequent semesters, only once by registering and paying fee.
- iv. A student shall register for all subjects for total of 68 credits as specified and listed in thecourse structure for the chosen specialization, put in required the attendance and fulfill theacademic requirements for securing 68 credits obtaining a minimum of 'B' Grade orabove in each subject, and all 68 credits securing Semester Grade Point Average(SGPA)

 6.0(in each and final Cumulative Grade Point semester) Average (CGPA)(i.e., CGPA at the end of PGP) \(\sigma 6.0\), to complete the PGP successfully.

Note:

- (1) The SGPA will be computed and printed on the marks memo only if thecandidate passes in all the subjects offered and gets minimum B grade in allthe subjects.
- (2)CGPA is calculated only when the candidate passes in all the subjects offered in all the semesters
- v. Marks and Letter Grades obtained in all those subjects covering the above specified 68credits alone shall be considered for the calculation of final CGPA, which will be indicated in the Grade Card /Marks Memo of second year second semester.
- vi. If a student registers for extra subject(s) (Audit courses in the parent department or other departments/branches of Engineering) other than those listed subjects totaling to 68 credits as specifiedin the course structure, the performance in extra subject(s) (although evaluated and gradedusing the same procedure as that of the required 68 credits) will not be taken into accountwhile calculating the SGPA and CGPA. For such extra subject(s) registered, percentage ofmarks and Letter Grade alone will be indicated in the

- Grade Card/Marks Memo, as aperformance measure, subject to completion of the attendance and academic requirements as stated in items 5 and 6.
- vii. When a student is detained due to shortage of attendance in any subject(s) in any semester, no Grade allotment will be made for such subject(s). However, he is eligible for re-registration of such subject(s) in the subsequent semester(s), as and when next offered, withthe academic regulations of the batch into which he is re-registered, by paying the prescribed fees per subject. In all these re-registration cases, the student shall have to secure a fresh set of internal marks and Semester End Examination marks for performance evaluation in such subject(s), and SGPA/CGPA calculations.
- viii. A student eligible to appear for the Semester End Examination in any subject, but absentfrom it or failed (failing to secure 'B' Grade or above), may reappear for that subject at the supplementary examination as and when conducted by registering and paying fee. Only two attempts are allowed for any subject. In such cases, his Internal Marksassessed earlier for that subject will be carried over, and added to the marks secured in the supplementary examination, for the purpose of evaluating his performance in that subject.
- ix. A Student who fails to earn 68 credits as per the specified course structure, and as indicated above, within four academic years from the date of commencement of his first year first semester, shall for feit his seat in M.Tech. programme and his admission shall standcancelled.

7. Evaluation - Distribution and Weightage of Marks

i. The performance of a student in each semester shall be evaluated subject- wise (irrespective of credits assigned) for a maximum of 100 marks. The M.Tech. projectwork (major project) will also be evaluated for 100 marks.

- ii. For the theory subjects 70 marks shall be awarded for the performance in the Semester End Examination and 30 marks shall be awarded for Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE).
- iii. For theory subjects, during a semester, there shall be two midterm examinations. The Continuous Internal Evaluation shall be made based on the average of the marks secured in the two MidTerm Examinations conducted, first Mid-Term examinations in the middle of the Semester and second Mid-Term examinations during the last week of instruction.
- iv. Each mid-term examination consists of descriptive paper & participatory learning activity. Out of 30 CIE marks, 10 marks are allotted for participatory learning activity and the remaining 20 marks are based on the average of two tests (weightage for each test is 20 marks).
- v. Each Mid-Term Examination shall be conducted for a total duration of 90 minutes. The question paper for mid-term examination will be in two parts, Part-A and Part-B. Part A is compulsory and carries Eight (08) marks (4 short notes for 2 marks each). Part-B carries Twelve (12) marks (student has to answer Three out of Five questions), each carries 4 marks.
- vi. The test shall be conducted as per the schedule prescribed by the college If any student is absent from any subject of a mid-term examination, re-examination will be conducted for the students with genuine reasons after approval by Head of the respective department and Head of the institution.
- vii. This is an on-line test (Computer Based Test) and will be conducted for him by the Institute.

Participatory Learning Activity (PLA):

Students can learn the subject by various participatory methods. These methods form the base for internal assessment of the students. Assessment will be done based on quality participation of students in the learning method of respective subject. Teacher and student can mutually decide one of the following methods for assessment:

- ➤ Innovative Technical presentations
- ➤ Group Activity
- Case Study Analysis
- > Micro Project
- > Participation in Professional Society Activities
- > Organizing technical activities
- Industrial visit or expert interview report(Industrial Analysis Report)
- > Idea presentation/Quiz competition
- > Innovative assignment

The following procedure is to be followed for internal evaluation as given in the below table

The faculty can choose any other two Participatory learning activities depend on the nature of the subject with the prior approval of the Head of the department.

The details of the Question Paper pattern for Semester End Examination (Theory) are givenbelow:

The Semester End Examination will be conducted for 70 marks. It consists of two parts.

- a. Part A for 20 marks, and Part B for 50 marks.
- b. Part A is compulsory and consists of 5 questions, one from each unit and carrying 4marks each.
- c. Part B consists of 5 questions carrying 10 marks each. There will be two questions from each unit and only one should be answered.
- d. Again 30 four mark questions and 30 ten mark questions are prepared and stored in the server at beginning of the semester. Question paper is prepared by choosing randomly from the question bank and printed.
- ii. For practical subjects, 70 marks shall be awarded for performance in the Semester EndExaminations and 30 marks shall be awarded for day-to-day performance as Internal Marks. These 30 marks are divided into 10 for performing experiment, 5 for observations, 5 for record writing and 10 for first MID, 10 for second MID. In every lab class student is evaluated for performing the experiment, observations and record wring and the marks are entered in the server along with attendance on the same day. Average of all the Lab classes marks are taken at the end of the semester for computing CIE marks.
- iii. For conducting laboratory end examinations of all PG Programmes, one internal examinerand one external examiner are to be appointed by the Principal of the College and this is tobe informed to the Controller of Examination(CoE) within two weeks, before commencement of thelab end examinations. The external examiner should be selected from outside the Collegeconcerned. No external examiner should be appointed from anyother College which is run/

- partnered by the same Management. 70 marks are divided into 20+25+25. 20 for write-up of experiment, 25 marks for demonstrating results, and 25 marks for viva.
- iv. There shall be Mini project and seminar presentations during I year II semester. For seminar, a student shall collect the literature on the advanced topic inrelevant fields and critically review the literature and submit it to the department in a form of report (20 pages) and shall make an oral presentation (60 minutes) before the Department Academic Committeeconsisting of Head of the seminar coordinator and two other Department, facultymembers of the department. One must be from outside department. For each Seminar there will be only internal evaluation for 100marks. Division of the marks is 30 marks for report preparation and 70 marks for presentation. A candidate has to secure a minimum of 50% (50) of marks to be declared successful. Ifhe fails to obtain the minimum mark, he has to reappear for the seminar during thesupplementary examinations by registering and paying fee. Maximum number of such attempts are as CAC approval. The word 'Seminar' implies presentation of Technical Report presentation/ discussion on the state of Art of Technology.
- v. The seminar shall cover concepts of abstract, introduction, material and methods, conclusion, references, acknowledgement etc of advanced topics in a branch of Engineeringthrough the medium of attending seminars/ referring to peer reviewed journals, which willenhance the skill of writing technical reports. The students shall not be required to give oralpresentation of technical paper. The report shall be presented as a printed document forevaluation. Evaluation shall be made solely by the teacher, but may be moderated bycommittees appointed by the Head of the Department as per Institute rules.

- vi. Student must undergo at least8 week Industrial Internship between II and III semester gap and submit certificate. This Internship is mandatory but does not carry any marks or credits.
- vii. Every candidate shall be required to submit a thesis or dissertation on a topic approved by the Project Review Committee.
- viii. A Project Review Committee (PRC) shall be constituted with the Head of the Department as Chairperson, Project Supervisor and one senior faculty member of the Departments offering the M. Tech. programme.
- ix. **Registration of Project Work**: A candidate is permitted to register for the project work aftersatisfying the attendance requirement in all the subjects, both theory and practicals.
 - a. After satisfying above, a candidate has to present in Project Work Review I, in consultationwith his Project Supervisor, the title, objective and plan of action of his project work to the Project Work Review Committee (PRC) for approval within four weeks from the commencement of Second year First Semester. Only after obtaining the approval of the PRCcan the student initiate the Project work.
 - b. If a candidate wishes to change his supervisor or topic of the project, he can do so with theapproval of the PRC. However, the PRC shall examine whether or not the change oftopic/supervisor leads to a major change of his initial plans of project proposal. If yes, hisdate of registration for the project work starts from the date of change of Supervisor or topicas the case may be.
 - c. A candidate shall submit his project progress report in two stages at least with a gap of threemonths between them.
 - d. The work on the project shall be initiated at the beginning of the II year and the duration of the project is two semesters. A candidate is permitted to submit Project Thesis only

- aftersuccessful completion of all theory and practical courses with the approval of PRC notearlier than 44 weeks from the date of approval of the project work. For the approval of PRCthe candidate shall submit the draft copy of thesis to the Head of the Department and makean oral presentation before the PRC.
- x. The Project Work Review II in II Year I Sem. carries internal marks of 100. Evaluationshould be done by the PRC for 70 marks (before end of III semester) and the Supervisor will evaluate the work for theother 30 marks. The Supervisor and PRC will examine the Problem Definition, Objectives, Scope of Work, Literature Survey in the same domain and progress of the Project Work. Acandidate has to secure a minimum of 50% of marks to be declared successful in ProjectWork Review II. If he fails to obtain the minimum required marks, he has to reappear for Project Work Review-II as and when conducted.
- xi. The Project Work Review III in II Year II Sem. carries 100 internal marks. Evaluationshould be done by the PRC for 70 marks (in two stages with a gap of two months) and the Supervisor will evaluate it for the other 30marks. Out of this 5 marks will be for publishing the work in UGC recognized journal. The PRC will examine the overall progress of the Project Work and decide whetheror not the Project is eligible for final submission. A candidate has to secure a minimum of50% of marks to be declared successful in Project Work Review III. If he fails to obtain therequired minimum marks, he has to reappear for Project Work Review III as and whenconducted. For Project Evaluation (Viva Voce) in II Year II Sem. there are external marks of100 and it is evaluated by the external examiner. The candidate has to secure a minimum of50% marks in Project Evaluation (Viva-Voce) examination.
- xii. Project Work Reviews II and III shall be conducted in phase I (Regular) and Phase II(Supplementary). Phase II will be conducted

only for unsuccessful students in Phase I. Theunsuccessful students in Project Work Review II (Phase II) shall reappear for it at the time of Project Work Review III (Phase I). These students shall reappear for Project Work ReviewIII in the next academic year at the time of Project Work Review II only after completion of Project Work Review II, and then Project Work Review III follows. The unsuccessful students in Project Work Review III (Phase II) shall reappear for Project Work Review III in the next academic year only at the time of Project Work Review II (Phase I). However, only one such extra attempt is allowed for each review.

- xiii. After approval from the PRC, a soft copy of the thesis should be submitted for ANTIPLAGIARISMcheck and the plagiarism report should be submitted to the Institute and beincluded in the final thesis. The Thesis will be accepted for submission, if the similarity index is less than 30%. If the similarity index has more than the required percentage, the student is advised to modify accordingly and re-submit the soft copy of the thesis after onemonth. The maximum number of re-submissions of thesis after plagiarism check is limited to Three. The candidate has to register for the Project work and work for two semesters. Afterthree attempts, the admission is liable to be cancelled. The college authorities are advised tomake plagiarism check of every soft copy of thesis before submissions.
- xiv. Three copies of the Project Thesis certified by the supervisor shall be submitted to the College/School/Institute, after submission of a research paper related to the project work in aUGC approved journal. A copy of the submitted research paper shall be attached to thesis.
- xv. The thesis shall be adjudicated by an external examiner selected by the Principal. For this, the Department of the College/School/Institute shall submit a panel of threeexaminers

from among the list of experts in the relevant specialization as submitted by the supervisorconcerned and Head of the Department.

- xvi. If the report of the external examiner is unsatisfactory, the candidate shall revise andresubmit the Thesis. If the report of the examiner is unsatisfactory again, the thesis shall besummarily rejected. Subsequent actions for such dissertations may be considered, only onthe specific recommendations of the external examiner and /or Project work ReviewCommittee. No further correspondence in this matter will be entertained, if there is nospecific recommendation for resubmission.
- xvii. If the report of the examiner is satisfactory, the Head of the Department shall coordinate andmake arrangements for the conduct of Project Viva- Voce examination. The Project Viva-Voce examination shall be conducted by a board consisting of the Supervisor, Head of the Department and the external examiner who adjudicated the Thesis. The candidate has to secure a minimum of 50% of marks in Project Evaluation (Viva-Voce) examination.
- xviii. If he fails to fulfill the requirements as specified above, he will reappear for the Viva-Voceexamination only after three months. In the reappeared examination also, if he fails to fulfillthe requirements, he will not be eligible for the award of the degree, unless he is asked torevise and resubmit his project work by the board within a specified time period (within fouryears from the date of commencement of his first year first semester).
- xix. The Project Viva-Voce External examination marks must be submitted to the entered in the server onthe day of the examination.
- xx. In every valuation and distribution of weightages proper mapping to Bloom's Taxonomy levels is adopted

8. Re-Admission/Re-Registration

- i. Re-Admission for Discontinued Student
 - A student, who has discontinued the M.Tech. degree programme due to any reasonwhatsoever, may be considered for 'readmission' into the same degree programme (with thesame specialization) with the academic regulations of the batch into which he gets readmitted, with prior permission from the authorities concerned, subject to item 6.6.
- ii. If a student is detained in a subject (s) due to shortage of attendance in any semester, he maybe permitted to re-registerfor the same subject(s) in the same category (core or electivegroup) or equivalent subject, if the same subject is not available, as suggested by the Board ofStudies of that department, as and when offered in the subsequent semester(s), with theacademic regulations of the batch into which he seeks re-registration, with prior permissionfrom the authorities concerned, subject to item 3.2
- iii. A candidate shall be given one chance to re-register for a maximum of two subjects, if theinternal marks secured by a candidate are less than 50% and failed in those subjects. Acandidate must re-register for failed subjects within four weeks of commencement of the classwork and secure the required minimum attendance. In the event of the student taking this chance, his Continuous Internal Evaluation (internal) marks and Semester End Examinationmarks obtained in the previous attempt stand cancelled.

9. Examinations and Assessment - The Grading System

i. Grades will be awarded to indicate the performance of each student in each Theory Subject, or Lab/Practicals, or Seminar, or Technical Paper Writing or Project, etc., based on the % ofmarks obtained in CIE + SEE (Continuous Internal Evaluation + Semester

- End Examination, both taken together) as specified in Item 7 above, and a corresponding Letter Grade shallbe given.
- ii. As a measure of the student's performance, a 10-point Absolute Grading System using thefollowing Letter Grades (UGC Guidelines) and corresponding percentage of marks shall befollowed:

- iii. A student obtaining F Grade in any Subject is deemed to have 'failed' and is required toreappear as 'Supplementary Candidate' for the Semester End Examination (SEE), as andwhen conducted. In such cases, his Internal Marks (CIE Marks) in those subjects will remain as obtained earlier.
- iv. A student has not appeared for the examinations; 'Ab' Grade will be allocated to him forany subject and shall be considered 'failed' and will be required to reappear as 'Supplementary Candidate' for the Semester End Examinatio 789+--*/n (SEE), as and when conducted.
- v. A Letter Grade does not imply any specific marks percentage; it is only the range of percentage of marks.
- vi. In general, a student shall not be permitted to repeat any Subject/Course (s) only for the sakeof 'Grade Improvement' or 'SGPA/CGPA Improvement'.

- vii. A student earns Grade Point (GP) in each Subject/ Course, on the basis of the Letter Gradeobtained by him in that Subject/ Course. The corresponding 'Credit Points' (CP) are computed by multiplying the Grade Point with Credits for that particular Subject/ Course.

 Credit Points (CP) = Grade Point (GP) x Credits For a Course
- viii. The student passes the Subject/ Course only when he gets GP >=6 (B Grade or above).
- ix. The Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) is calculated by dividing the Sum of CreditPoints (ΣCP) secured from ALL Subjects/ Courses registered in a Semester, by the TotalNumber of Credits registered during that Semester. SGPA is rounded off to TWO DecimalPlaces. SGPA is thus computed as

SGPA = $\sum C_i G_i / \sum C_i$ where i = 1 to N subjects of that semester, Credits for that subject and G grade point obtained

where 'i' is the Subject indicator index (taking into account all Subjects in a Semester), 'N' is the no. of Subjects 'REGISTERED' for the Semester (as specifically required and listedunder the Course Structure of the parent Department), Ci is the no. of Credits allotted to the imSubject, and Girepresents the Grade Points (GP) corresponding to the Letter Grade awardedfor that imSubject.

x. The Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) is a measure of the overall cumulative performance of a student over all Semesters considered for registration. The CGPA is the ratio of the Total Credit Points secured by a student in ALL registered Courses in ALLSemesters, and the Total Number of Credits registered in ALL the Semesters. CGPA is rounded off to TWO Decimal Places. CGPA is thus computed from the I Year SecondSemester onwards, at the end of each Semester, as per the formula

 $CGPA = \sum C_i \ G_i \ / \ \sum Ci$ where i = 1 to M subjects of all the semesters including current semester, Credits for that subject and G grade point obtained

where 'M' is the TOTAL no. of Subjects (as specifically required and listed under the CourseStructure of the parent Department) the Student has 'REGISTERED' for from the 1stSemester onwards upto and inclusive of the present Semester (obviously M > N), 'i' is the Subjectindicator index (taking into account all Subjects from 1 to current Semesters), Ciis the no. ofCredits allotted to the ihSubject, and Girepresents the Grade Points (GP) corresponding to the Letter Grade awarded for that ihSubject. After registration and completion of I Year ISemester however, the SGPA of that Semester itself may be taken as the CGPA, as there are no cumulative effects.

10. Award of Degree and Class

i. If a student who registers for all the specified Subjects/ Courses as listed in the CourseStructure, satisfies all the Course Requirements, and passes the examinations prescribed in theentire PG Programme (PGP), and secures the required number of **68**Credits (with CGPA≥6.0), shall be declared to have 'QUALIFIED' for the award of the M.Tech. Degree in thechosen

Branch of Engineering and Technology with the specialization that he was admittedinto.

ii. Award of Class

After a student has earned the requirements prescribed for the completion of the programme and is eligible for the award of M.Tech. Degree, he shall be placed in one of the following three classes based on the CGPA:

iii. A student with final CGPA (at the end of the PGP) < 6.00shall not be eligible for the Awardof Degree

11. Withholding of Results

If the student has not paid the dues, if any, to the University or if any case of indiscipline ispending against him, the result and degree of the student will be withheld and he will not be allowed into the next semester.

12. Transitory Regulations

i. A student who has been detained in any semester of I Year due tolack of attendance, shall be permitted to join the same semester of I Year of subsequent year and he is required to complete the study of M.Tech programme within the stipulated period offour academic years from the date of first admission in I Year I semester. The AcademicRegulations under which a student has been readmitted shall be applicable to that studentfrom that semester.

- ii. Candidate detained due to shortage of attendance in one or more subjects is eligible for re-registration maximum of two earlier or equivalent subjects at a time as and when offered.
- iii. The candidate who fails in any subject will be given two chancesto pass the same subject in the same regulations; otherwise, he has to identify an equivalent subject and fulfill the academic requirements of that subject as per new Academic Regulations applicable at that time.
- iv. For student readmitted to new Regulations, the maximum credits that a student acquires forthe award of the degree, shall be the sum of the total number of credits secured in previous regulations of his/her study including current Regulations.
- v. If a student readmitted to new Regulations, has any subject with 80% of syllabus commonwith his/her previous regulations, that particular subject in new regulations will besubstituted by another subject to be suggested by the Institute.

13. General

- i. Credit: A unit by which the course work is measured. It determines the number of hours of of neurons required per week. One credit is equivalent to one hour of teaching (lecture ortutorial) or two hours of practical work/field work per week.
- ii. Credit Point: It is the product of grade point and number of credits for a course.
- iii. Wherever the words "he", "him", "his", occur in the regulations, they shall include "she", "her".
- iv. The academic regulation should be read as a whole for the purpose of any interpretation.
- v. In case of any doubt or ambiguity in the interpretation of the above rules, the decision of the Institute is final.
- vi. The Institute may change or amend the academic regulations or syllabi at any time and thechanges or amendments made shall be

applicable to all the students with effect from the dates notified by the Institute.
